Thomas Belsham (26 April 1750 – 11 November 1829) was an English Unitarian minister. Belsham was born in Bedford, England, and was the elder brother of William Belsham, the English political writer and historian. He was educated at the dissenting academy at Daventry, where for seven years he acted as assistant tutor. After three years spent in a charge at Worcester, he returned as head of Daventry Academy, a post which he continued to hold till 1789, when, having adopted Unitarian principles, he Thomas Belsham was an English Unitarian minister.
