The Perfect and Complete Gospel of Both Comings of Jesus Christ: Reclaiming Eschatology in Pentecostal Proclamation of the Gospel

Abstract

This article is written to encourage a return to a position firmly entrenched in traditional Pentecostal and Charismatic eschatology that includes both comings of Jesus Christ in the proclamation of the Gospel. It develops the concept of the "Perfect/Complete Gospel of Both Comings of Jesus Christ," identifying it as an emphasis in both historic Christianity in general and Pentecostal-Charismatic Christianity in particular. And in light of Oral Roberts' vision received in August 2004, the article concludes with an exhortation to reconsider this proclamation in light of the imminent return of Jesus Christ.

Where in the Gospels do we find the Lord's Prayer, and why is it significant? Matthew and Luke, given to us by Jesus, most likely genuine, and it asks for all we could rightly ask for. Define parable His desire to complete his father's will even though it meant finishing the cup of suffering to his own death. True or False? Jesus had no choice but to suffer and die. What does imminent future eschatology mean? The idea that Jesus is coming back real soon. What does realized eschatology mean? The idea that Jesus has already initiated the Kingdom and is in the process of coming back. What is the parousia? second coming of Christ. What did Jesus say about when the end of the world would happen? He didn't know. Answer: The word gospel means "good news," so the gospel of Christ is the good news of His coming to provide forgiveness of sins for all who will believe (Colossians 1:14; Romans 10:9). Since the first man's sin, mankind has been under the condemnation of God (Romans 5:12). Because everyone breaks God's perfect law by committing sin, everyone is guilty (Romans 3:23). The punishment for the crime of sin is physical death (Romans 6:23) and then an eternity spent in a place of punishment (Revelation 20:15; Matthew 25:46). This eternal separation from God is also called the "second death" (Revelation 20:15). People need the Lord Jesus like never ever before, and for many, they will only ever hear the Gospel, and see it through our lives! In this 12-day devotional you will be encouraged by Angus Buchan to share the Gospel and tell the whole world that Jesus is Lord!
